- 2. Minimum college GPA of 2.5 (the program is very competitive; GPAs above 3.0 improve the applicants chances of acceptance)

- 5. Complete program application (form located on website)
- 6. Acceptable scores (75 and above) on the HESI
- 7. Three completed reference forms (form located on website) **Reference forms must be sent by the individual** completing them. No reference forms from applicants will be accepted, either in person or mailed with other documentation. Reference forms cannot be completed by family members.
  - 8. Completed documentation of all required immunizations.
- 9. Deadline for application is April 30<sup>th</sup> each year. This is for all program paperwork. (All program paperwork can be emailed to <u>radtech@odessa.edu</u>. Documentation must be submitted as a PDF attachment.) However, all courses completed at the end of spring semesters will be considered in the application process.
- 10. If possible, students should complete RADR 1201 Introduction to Radiography by the end of the spring semester in which they are applying.

Students with highest point totals will then proceed to an interview, where only the GPA and the interview will be considered.
